Resources – How should support, both within and outside education be allocated or awarded to reinforce the effective implementation of the K-20 system? *For example,*

how can efficiencies in the transition of students within and among the major delivery systems, pre- K, K-12, colleges and universities- and external entities such as Juvenile Justice, Children and Familites, and Workforce Innovation, be supported and rewarded?

Results – Is the overall mission and progress toward its attainment clearly communicated at all levels? *What milestones and measures are needed to monitor the progress and success of the entire K-20 system and each component of its overall structure?*

These four "Rs" will form the cornerstones of the discussion of the achievement of each of the long range issues and imperatives identified in the Plan, acknowledging appropriate objectives and strategies from FBOE's Strategic Plan.

Long Range Performance Plan

LONG-RANGE PERFORMANCE PLAN

Section 1008.51(4)(d), F.S., specifies the Council shall submit for approval, to the State Board of Education, a long-range performance plan for K-20 education in Florida and annually review and recommend improvements in the implementation of the plan.

The plan will be designed to monitor progress related to the K-20 goals established in law, performance goals adopted by the State Board of Education, the State Board of Education Strategic Plan objectives, and implementation of policies and strategies recommended in the long-range Master Plan.

The performance plan will incorporate 360 Degree Feedback, initially developed 30 years ago for use in corporate personnel management and evaluation. A modified version of this approach is proposed to provide a complete assessment of the progress of the K-20 system.

ANNUAL REPORT CARD

Section 1008.51(4)(e), F.S., requires the Council to annually report on the progress of public schools and postsecondary education institutions toward meeting educational goals and standards as defined in s. 1008.31. In addition, Section 1001.11(2)(a) specifies that the Commissioner of Education shall recommend to the State Board of Education performance goals addressing the educational needs of the state for the K-20 education system. The Council for Education Policy Research and Improvement, as an independent entity, shall develop a report card assigning grades to indicate Florida's progress toward meeting those goals. The annual report card shall contain information showing Florida's performance relative to other states on selected measures, as well as Florida's ability to meet the need for postsecondary degrees and programs and how well the Legislature has provided resources to meet this need. The information shall include the results of the National Assessment of Educational Progress or a similar national assessment program administered to students in Florida. By January 1 of each year, the Council for Education Policy Research and Improvement shall submit the report card to the Legislature, the Governor, and the public.

Beginning in January 2004, the report card will be used to address both of these requirements and will be based on the overall Performance Plan and include ongoing standard measures as well as selected indicators for current priority initiatives.
